Format: Pool Play

Day 1 - 6 game-set

Day 2 - Individual winners from each pool will play at Westside in a bracket-style tournament, 2 Sets and the 3rd set 10-point tiebreak if needed.

Divisions: #1 Singles #2 Singles #1 Doubles #2 Doubles

Entry Rules:

1. Each team may enter two singles and two doubles entries
2. Players play at a single entry and may not switch once play has started.
3. Players must be current non-varsity players. Freshman-Juniors are eligible.

Food: No hospitality rooms

Trainer: At Westside on Final Day

Team Scoring: The individual winners of each pool will compete on the final day. If there is a tie within the pool, the head-to-head matchup will determine who advances to the semifinal and final matches on Monday.

Rules

- Any rules of conduct violation shall be subject to a warning.
 - A second warning will result in disqualification from the tournament and a default of the match in progress and all subsequent matches.
 - All coaches will be tournament officials and authorized to give such warnings.
- Warnings shall be given for any of the following:
 - Racket abuse
 - Ball abuse
 - Profanity or obscenity
 - Unreasonable shouting or any other action which is likely to interfere with the concentration efforts of the opponent or players on adjacent courts
- If a player is not ready to play within ten minutes of her scheduled match time, she will be defaulted.
- Coaching according to the NSAA Tennis Manual. One head and one assistant coach is allowed.
 - Coaches are allowed to coach between points as long as it doesn't affect the normal pace of the game.
- Players shall be allowed a ten-minute warm-up (including serves) before their first match; a five-minute warm-up every match thereafter. Coaches are asked to assist in enforcing this.
- BOTH players shall report the score and return the balls to the scorer's table.
- If a player believes it is necessary, she may request a judge and one will be provided as soon as, and if, available. Play shall not be stopped to wait for a judge after request. Coaches are requested to act as judges if needed.
- Each team is responsible for its valuables.

Friendly reminder: please limit odd-game changeovers to 90 seconds... including coaching time.
